Book Discussion: How the Word Is Passed by Clint Smith

This NY Times #1 bestselling book is a deeply researched exploration of the legacy of slavery and its imprint on centuries of American history. This is Smith's first non-fiction book, and it deftly illustrates how some of our nation's most essential stories are hidden in plain view—whether in places we might drive by on our way to work, holidays such as Juneteenth, or entire neighborhoods like downtown Manhattan, where the brutal history of the trade in enslaved men, women, and children has been deeply imprinted. Informed by scholarship and brought to life by the story of people living today, this book offers a new understanding of the hopeful role that memory and history can play in making sense of our country and how it has come to be. This discussion will take place via Zoom and a link will be sent out prior to the first session.
