Their main goal is to mentor young at risk ladies in prevention of becoming a victim of human trafficking. - Sign up to greet at the airport, intermodal (train/bus) station, or hotels without registering for Synod, however you still have to register as a volunteer and sign up for one of these assignments.
- Receive information on free housing at local UCC homes and at nearby Marquette University for about $1 / 4$ the cost of a downtown hotel.
