"Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide

for those who arrested Jesus — for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." - Acts 1:16-17 (NRSV)

They come to church looking so good, wearing crisply pressed shirts, or expertly applied makeup. Their children are dressed in coordinating outfits. Their grandchildren are Fulbright scholars. Their work is successful and satisfying. They haven't been sick a day in their lives. They seem doubt-free and contented.

We might go to church trying not to look as lame as our bad hip feels. Ignoring the judgmental looks people give our slightly-more-than-whispering kids. Hoping no one asks why our spouse never attends anymore. Avoiding questions about our job (laid off) or our academic prospects (failed) or our spiritual health (doubtful). We wonder if our troubles are safe for worship.

One of Peter's first acts of leadership was to find a new disciple to replace Judas, who had done something a lot more dastardly than getting a bad score on the SATs or going into rehab. He had betrayed not just Jesus, but the whole community. His gruesome fate as recorded in Acts 1:15-20 is not often considered safe content for worship, but it must have hung over those early gatherings of the faithful.

When we want to hide our struggles, we remember that the church began among hurting people who had to own their pain before they could reorganize themselves and start to spread the good news.

#### Prayer

Holy One, help us to remember that no matter what pain or loss we bring with us to worship, we are coming to you. You accept us as we are; we are safe with you. Amen.

# online GIVING easy. fast. effective


No matter, how big or small of an amount you want to give, online giving and text giving is now available at Parkside Community UCC.


#### Libraries:

### **Obituary for Former Pastor Rev. Don Ellerman**



Reverend Donald Edgar Ellerman was called home in the early morning hours of July 9, 2019. He was born in Quincy, IL on April 17, 1951 to Elmo Arthur and Marjorie Dean (McNay) Ellerman. He graduated from Quincy Senior High School before enlisting in the United States Air Force on December 3, 1969 and honorably discharged July 3, 1973. He was stationed in Texas, Mississippi, Taiwan, and Italy.

He met the love of his life, Gladys E. (Leason) Ellerman when she was backpacking through Europe while he was stationed in Italy. They were married after a whirlwind romance on September 12, 1972 in the mayor's office in Bindisi, Italy and then had a ceremony with family and friends on September 26, 1972 at the San Vito Air Station Chapel. They were blessed with three amazing daughters, Kristy (Shawn) Runge of St. Louis, MO, Susan (Theodore decd. 2018) Leung of Gurnee, IL, and Sarah (Matthew) Sund of Madison. WI.

After working 9 years with the United States Postal Service, Don answered God's call and began his ministry as a faithful servant. He graduated from John Woods Community College with an associate degree in accounting in 1979. After receiving his Bachelor of Theology from Quincy College in 1982, moved with his family to Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis, MO where he obtained his Masters of Divinity in 1985 and was ordained in the United Church of Christ. During his ministry he served four churches, Southminster Presbyterian Church in Crestwood, MO (1983-1985), Immanuel United Church of Christ in Latimer, IA (1985-1993), Calvary Memorial United Church of Christ in Wauwatosa, WI (1993- 2001), and St. Peter's United Church of Christ in Saukville, WI (2002-2011). When Don and Gladys retired they moved to Fairhaven Senior Services, a retirement community in Whitewater, WI. He also served on the WI Conference Board of Directors and represented Fairhaven at the CHHSM (Council for Health and Human Services Ministries).

Don loved his 9 grandchildren, Corbin, Ashlyn, Gavin, & Adilyn Runge; Abigail, Justin, & Emma Leung, and Isaac & Ellie Sund. He was an avid biker and taught all 9 of his grandchildren how to ride. He missed his lifetime goal of 100,000 miles, by only reaching 93,047 miles in 22 years. He also loved camping, tree trimming with his chain saws, gardening, and farming.

He is preceded in death by his son-in-law, Theodore W. Leung; sister, Constance J. (Ellerman) Mayfield; brothers, William E. & Richard E. Ellerman, and both his parents Elmo & Marjorie Ellerman.

He is survived by his wife, Gladys, of 46 years; 3 daughters - Kristy, Susan, & Sarah; 2 son-in-laws – Shawn & Matthew; 9 grandchildren; sister, Mary Jane Ellerman; uncle, Robert (Doc) Ellerman and nieces & nephews.
