I have been thinking a lot about connection lately, probably because of the absence of physical connection. We all ache for normalcy to return and restore these physical connections to one another. Being with others gives our lives dimension that is lacking when all we can do is connect electronically.

But we are stuck in the “not yet”. If we are wise and follow the Badger Bounce Back plan that Gov. Evers has recommended it could be a long time before we are together again as a church. This virus has highlighted the negative side of connection, it is the very engine that can drive it’s spread and the lack of it is how we can fight it. Yet connection is fundamental to our mental and spiritual health. I think we have all found creative ways for connection because we are built to seek it out. This period in our history could be a new beginning for understanding a spiritual and scientific truth. Albert Einstein wrote:

“A human being is a part of the whole, called by us universe, a part limited in time and space. He experiences himself, his thoughts and feeling as something separated from the rest, a kind of optical delusion of his consciousness. This delusion is a kind of prison for us, restricting us to our personal desires and to affection for a few persons nearest to us. Our task must be to free ourselves from this prison by

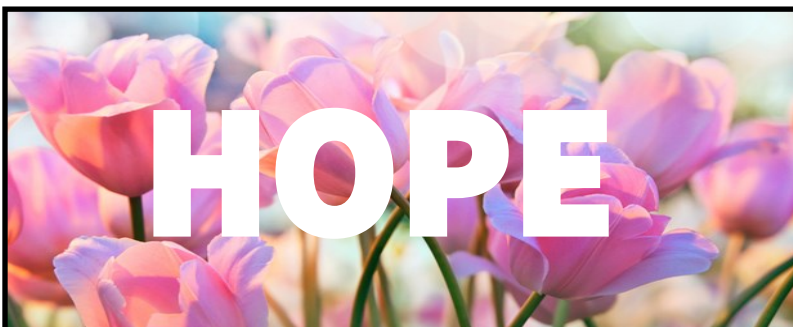

# Welcome Pastor Susan!

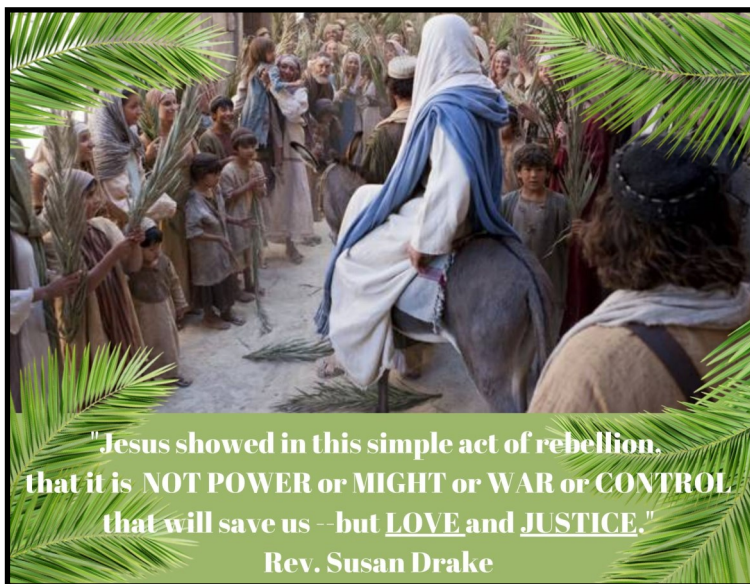

## BUILDING & GROUNDS

There have been quite a few updates around the building & church house to let you know about:

- 4 new Ecobee Smart Thermostats have been installed, two in the Fellowship Hall and two in the Sanctuary. Our old thermostats were not working reliably. The new thermostats are easily programmable, can be locked to prevent unauthorized personnel from making changes, and they can also be remotely accessed so that we can make changes from off premises if needed. We will be receiving rebates from the Focus on Energy program to help offset the costs of the thermostats.
- A new water heater was installed in the church house.
- There was a problem with our grease trap in the church kitchen and it overflowed, creating quite a smelly mess in the basement and kitchen. Thank you to Nancy and Mark Gierach for cleaning up and organizing the pumping out of the pipes.
- With the building being empty a large period of time, our Church Custodian took the opportunity to arrange to have the Fellowship Hall and Fireside Room carpets cleaned. The carpets look great! Thank you, Nancy!
- We continue to work towards having the dishwasher in the kitchen replaced.
- In the next few weeks we will be having the kitchen hood professionally cleaned, this is long overdue and it is a requirement to pass our fire inspections.
