COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Council Meeting - Tuesday, March 6, 2024 6:45p.m.

Council Members Present: President: Vice President: Sue Sarver, Treasurer: Matt DeGroff, Secretary: Kaitlyn Watry, Wally Quade, Joan Brecke

Open with prayer by Sue.

Secretary Report: Motion made by Wally to accept the February meeting minutes, seconded by Joan. Motion passed.

Treasurer Report: Motion made by Joan to accept the February treasurer report, seconded by Wally. Motion passed.

Committee Reports: Faith Formation/Youth: no update

Lighthouse: Egg My Yard Fundraiser going until March 17th, 2024.

Stewardship: no update

Worship: Lenten services will be March 6th at Grand Ave, March 13th at Christ the King, and March 20th at 1st Congregational with a 6:00 meal and 7:00 service.

Maundy Thursday service is at 6:00 with communion. Pastor needs a loaf of bread (not cubed). Joan will handle communion set up and Sue will take care of decorations.

There will be no communion on Easter Sunday. There will be breakfast before Easter Sunday service but no fellowship afterwards.

Communion will be on April 7.

We are looking for more people to host fellowship after service.

Building & Grounds: Fans in fireside room need to be looked at.

Quote for electrical work to install security cameras came in around \$2000.00 so we will wait on that, Brady can re look at possible areas. There is an outlet by the mechanisms for the canopy doors would just need a few adjustments to be used for a camera.

Handicap button outside needs to be replaced with new battery, can't get plate off so will have Brady look at it.

To repair the doors at the canopy entrance the quote was \$5820 and to replace with two new doors, internal mechanisms and hardware the quote was \$11,127.00. Would also ask them to replace weatherstripping on the front doors. Joan made a motion to approve the spending to replace the canopy doors, internal mechanisms, and hardware with money from the Maintenance Trust Fund, seconded by Matt. Motion passed.

The door at the kitchen entrance needs to be sanded and repainted, Wally will get a quote to get this done.

Pictures of the internal wood doors by the canopy entrance were sent to Chelene's son in law to see if they can be repaired.

The broken tiles in the foyer would cost \$2600 to put new carpet tile in except for in the closet. To replace the tiles would cost \$1500 as well as put new carpet in the elevator. Matt thought he found some tiles in the basement to match so we will look into that before moving forward.

Ed will look at the lower level and get us any electrical code updates that need to be done. New replacement pieces for vinyl wood looking flooring in the basement kitchen to cover where the concrete is exposed.

Caring: no update

Missions: no update

Old Business:

AV System Update: Ed is here to talk through it with us, the council decided to keep the budget around \$50,000.

Lighting: Could be a separate line item not included in the AV system budget.

Sound: Would include wireless microphones as of now. Next step would be to meet with the current users of the system to see what parts can be excluded from costs. We won't be able to have a revised price until the meeting takes place so it should happen as soon as possible.

Video: Two new screens and a confidence monitor for the Pastor.

To bring the price down we could use two 96 inch tv screens mounted on the wall instead of the rear mounted projectors. The quality will still be good (high definition).

The price difference is about \$10,000.00 (two 96 inch tv screens around \$20,000.00 and rear mounted projectors around \$30,000.00).

The prices include the costs of equipment, installation, start up, and training and the equipment comes with a manufacturer's warranty.

Camera in place already for live streaming is good and will still work with new technology.

The cables for projection will be hard wired for better streaming connection.

Infrastructure (electric, cable, etc) still needs to be put in from the head of the sanctuary to av board in the back.

Discussion to start the infrastructure work after Holy Week, this work needs to get done before the new equipment arrives. Ed will look at the timeline and his schedule. Motion made by Wally to have Ed and contractors into church to do preliminary work, seconded by Joan. Motion passed.

Holiday Pay Policy: remove Friday after Thanksgiving on document per December council meeting minutes. That day can be requested off.

Incentive Agreement: still unfinished, discuss at April meeting when Heather is back.

New Business:

We will do an Easter ad in Ozaukee Press: \$225.00 for a 5x7 ad for two weeks and \$25.00 for Facebook advertisement, use last year's ad.

The internet bill has gone up so Carrie will look into lowering the cost. It is up to around \$90.00 and will work to get it closer to the \$50.00 we were paying.

Eagle Disposal: since we have less trash now we could reduce pickup to every other week instead of weekly. We already have the smallest size container so will continue to monitor and make a decision next month. It would save us around \$40.00-\$50.00 a month.

Upcoming council meeting dates: April 16, 2024, May 14, 2024, June 11, 2024, July 9, 2024, August 6, 2024, September 17, 2024. All meetings at 6:00p.m.

Motion to adjourn made by Wally, seconded by joan. Motion passed. Close with the Lord's prayer. Meeting adjourned.
