### Mission of the Month for May: Strengthen the Church

"If not us, then who? If not now, then when?" The questions of John Lewis – activist, legislator, and justice advocate – echoed in the art of Dr. Deborah Rundlett. She knew the heartfelt hopes and challenges of youth in her community. Youth wonder about what their world will look like. Despite these challenges, teens and young adults demonstrated a commitment to social



change, contributing energy and passion. Rev. Rundlett sought ways to help "unleash the potential and intrinsic power of area high school students to fulfill their capacity as current and future leaders and world citizens."

In response, Ridgebury Congregational Church, with community members, founded the "The Meetinghouse" which sits between two towns: one affluent yet progressive, with little diversity; the other multicultural, representing a wide diversity of peoples, economically, socially, and politically. The congregation saw an opportunity to bring together youth from both communities for dialogue, wisdom, and collaborative partnership.

With funding from the Strengthen the Church Offering and the State of Connecticut, Dr. Rundlett and The Meetinghouse are gathering high school students to "meet with leading social entrepreneurs, environmental designers, and social justice advocates to learn how to draw from respected leadership models and learn how to move intentional change in their contexts." Students decide on a pivotal social issue and then create initiatives to address change.

The Meetinghouse helps youth become change leaders empowered to shape a future grounded in hope. Rudy Marconi, the First Selectman (mayor) of one of the towns, recently spoke about the impact of this program. "Let me tell you what Debbie Rundlett and The Meetinghouse are doing: They are reclaiming the Commons and building a bridge between Ridgefield and Danbury. Essential work for our community!"

Innovative projects like The Meetinghouse happen because generous donors across the United Church of Christ support the Strengthen the Church Offering. Together, through this offering, we support leadership development, new churches, youth ministry, and innovation in existing congregations as we work to become a multicultural/multi-racial, accessible to all Christian movement.

Council Meeting - Tuesday, April 16, 2024 6:00p.m.

Secretary Report: Update March minutes for future record to show that we did serve communion on Easter Sunday. Motion made by Joan to accept the March meeting minutes, seconded by Wally. Motion passed.

Treasurer Report: Motion made by Wally to accept the March treasurer report, seconded by Joan. Motion passed.

Committee Reports: No updates this month, see newsletter for any committee updates.

#### Old Business:

AV System: No updates since March council meeting.

Holiday Pay Policy approved and signed by council member.

Incentive Agreement: approved and signed by council member.

Eagle Disposal: Decision made to switch to garbage pick up every other week and it will save the church about \$40-\$50 dollars.

Internet Bill: Carrie was able to get the internet bill lowered, not sure how long it will stay at this rate but hopefully at least six months.

#### **New Business:**

Grant is here to talk about basement updates due to the flooding from the recent rain storm, an insurance claim was filed right away and he is working with the insurance company. The claim will be open one year from the initial date. The basement essentially will be all redone due to water damage. The repairs include replacing all 22 wood doors downstairs (will be the same color as before), painting almost the entire basement (utility room, elevator, and bathroom will not be painted due to no paint damage), new flooring and baseboard and trim work. The elevator will also need quite a few repairs and will be out of order for an extended period of time. Grant does recommend a backup sump pump and moisture alarms. Everything from the basement has been moved to a storage facility for about 60 days for now, it is all at the Mr. Movers Saukville location.

He mentioned the furnaces were not damaged because that room already contains a floor drain. All rooms will also be cleaned. To move along the process council needs to choose new paint colors, new flooring, new carpeting for classrooms, and new baseboard, and decide on buying new kitchen cabinets or putting the old ones back in. Council did pick new colors for everything and is looking into quotes for new lower kitchen cabinets downstairs, if other cabinets were damaged there may be money to put towards new ones from the insurance company.

Joan will be the council liaison for Spellbound Sweets.

SE Association meeting is April 27, 2024 from 9am to 2:30p.m, no council members are interested in attending.


WI Conference meeting is June 7-9, 2024 at Green Lake. No one from the council is interested in attending, and can open to congregation members if anyone would like to attend.

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Phil. 4:6-7


